This year, door-to-door Trick or Treat is considered a high-risk activity by the CDC. Consider lower risk activities, examples on the next page. To maintain door-to-door Trick or Treat in the safest way possible take note of these guidelines and be super careful for yourself and for the kids:

### **Folks participating in Trick or Treat should ...**

-  Have an outdoor light on (outdoor lights off if you are not participating)
-  Only give out wrapped items. Wash or sanitize your hands when handling treats for kids
-  Keep visiting kids outside
-  Avoid handing treats to kids directly
-  Get creative to maintain 6-foot distance – offer items outside on a table. Or, create a 6-foot long treat dispenser. Or, extend treats on a witch's broom?

### **Trick or Treaters who are participating should ...**

-  Trick or Treat with family and household members
-  Avoid large groups and going inside homes or mudrooms
-  Wear protective, cloth face coverings – most Halloween masks are not actually protective substitutes

Because door-to-door Trick or Treat is considered a high-risk activity this year, here are examples of lower-risk Halloween activities:

### Low-Risk Examples



Carve pumpkins with family and household members



Carve pumpkins with friends and neighbors outside, at 6-foot distances



Have an open-air scavenger hunt for Halloween-themed things along a trail



Record a Halloween story with the people you live with

### Medium-Risk Examples



Set up individually wrapped treat bags along a one-way track where families can maintain 6-foot distance and pick up



Have an open-air costume parade or party, wear protective masks and maintain 6-foot distance



Set up a one-way walk through a haunted trail where appropriate mask use is enforced, and kids and adults can maintain social distance



Set up an outdoor Halloween movie viewing, families spaced at 6 feet
