What the Board is planning for Fall	What you can do
<p>The Select Board and Randy Jr. are reevaluating all aspects of how this facility is run, and will be implementing changes incrementally throughout the Fall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Remove irrelevant and illegible signs; Install signs to help navigate the facility; Improve access to the recycling bins; Repair the catch basin (August); Delineate the pass-through lane; Clear away used oil; Clear metal from under the Poultry trailer; and, Update tipping fee schedule (October). <p>We are also revisiting how and where to sell dump stickers, and will keep you informed about any changes.</p>	<p>To recycle steel and aluminum cans and to recycle paper fibers using the container bins, understand that contamination with non-recyclable items in either bin can result in the whole bin being rejected and disposed of as trash. It's on us to know what's what in order to recycle what we can.</p> <p>This means that the cans and plastics bin is only for rinsed #1 and #2 plastics. Other plastics, plastic bags, wraps, etc. go to the trash chute.</p> <p>Containers that have held solvents, petroleum and other hazardous fluids may not be tossed at this station. See Randy Jr. how to dispose of these.</p> <p>In the paper fibers bin, only cardboard, newspaper, magazines, office paper – and no waxed paper products and no food-contaminated papers.</p> <p>To recycle glass, only dispose rinsed jars and bottles down the glass chute. See Randy if you are unsure where to dispose light bulbs, plate glass, drinking glasses, glass knick-knacks, and other glass items. The Town recycles glass from this station as road maintenance material.</p> <p>As you know, the Town takes residents' brush, certain construction demo materials, metals, appliances, and other household waste. Randy can advise you what are the tipping fees and at which station to toss what.</p>
