

Are you registering to vote?

To register to vote in New Hampshire, you need to be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old on election day, and an NH resident. You will need proof of:



Identity



Age



U.S. Citizenship



NH Domicile

If your name has legally changed from what is listed on your proof documentation, bring additional documents that show how your name is tied to the name on your proof documentation. For identity, age, and United States citizenship, if you have a passport in your current name, no further proof is needed for those qualifications.

Some Examples of Proof Documents

Examples of proof documentation include but are not limited to:

Identity - Driver's license, government-issued ID, U.S. passport

Age - Driver's license, government-issued ID, U.S. passport

U.S. Citizenship - Birth certificate, naturalization certificate, U.S. passport/passcard

NH Domicile - Driver's license, government-issued ID, vehicle registration, tax document, government-issued check (all with current domicile address listed)

The following proof can only be used if it is paired with an Attestation Form (provided by your clerk): Lease agreement, bill with domicile address, Confirmation of Domicile Form (provided by your clerk)
